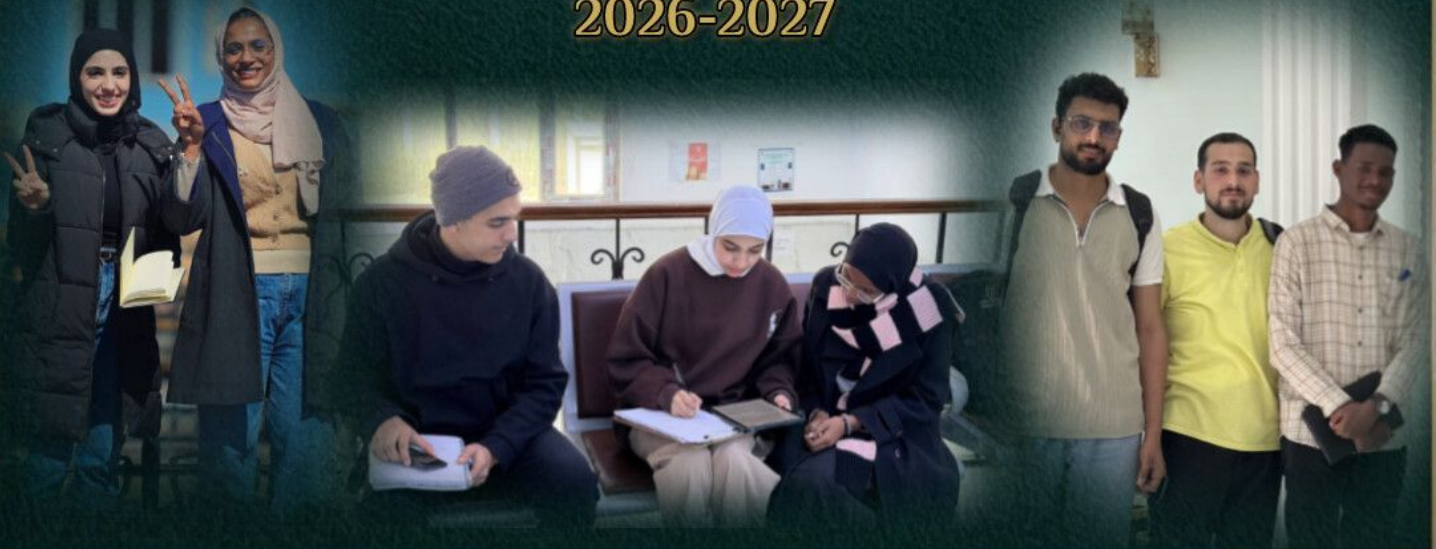

The University of Misan is a contemporary Iraqi public university, established in 2007 in the city of Amarah, the administrative center of Maysan Governorate in southern Iraq. The university encompasses various scientific and humanities faculties dedicated to addressing the evolving needs of society and the labor market. It operates on a strategic vision aimed at advancing higher education and elevating the caliber of scientific research to align with stringent global academic standards.

The institutional mission focuses on graduating highly competent scientific and leadership professionals equipped to serve the community. This is achieved through the optimal utilization of human and material resources, ensuring an ideal academic ecosystem. Furthermore, the university actively contributes to education, research, and public service, reinforcing its academic footprint through specialized scientific journals and robust administrative centers.

In its pursuit of internationalization, the University of Misan places paramount importance on attracting international students through the "Study in Iraq" initiative. | Medical and Health Sciences

- **Medicine (MBChB / MD):** A comprehensive 6-year academic and clinical program designed to prepare general medical practitioners capable of advanced diagnosis, treatment, and holistic healthcare provision.

Chapter Two (1/3)

Admission Requirements, Regulations, and Documentation

I. Conditions and Regulations for International Student Admission

The University of Misan cordially invites applications from international candidates globally under the "Study in Iraq" initiative. The admission, verification, and final endorsement procedures are governed by a set of general and specific institutional regulations designed to ensure absolute transparency and equal opportunity.

Eligible Academic Categories:

Our institution offers academic placements for international students across the following tiers:

- **Undergraduate Studies:** Leading to a Bachelor's degree across the university's scientific, humanities, and medical faculties.
- **Postgraduate Studies:** Leading to Master's and Doctoral (Ph.D.) degrees in designated departments in alignment with the university's strategic admission plan.

General and Specific Admission Requirements:

Applicants must strictly satisfy the following legal and health-related stipulations:

1. Nationality and Lineage Stipulations:

- The international applicant must be born to non-Iraqi parents.
- Neither the applicant nor their parents may be of Iraqi descent holding non-Iraqi citizenship.
- The applicant must not be of non-Iraqi descent while concurrently holding Iraqi citizenship.
- The applicant's (or their parents') place of birth must not be within Iraq. They must not possess an Iraqi residence permit or refugee status. (Exemptions apply exclusively to applicants applying via the self-funded/private channel).
- The applicant must submit a formal written pledge refraining from initiating any naturalization procedures to acquire Iraqi citizenship for the duration of their academic tenure.

2. Academic Qualifications and Prior Study:

- The applicant must possess a recognized high school (preparatory) diploma obtained outside Iraq. (Exemptions apply exclusively to self-funded channel applicants).
- The applicant must not hold a prior, concurrent admission at any Iraqi public or private university under alternative admission channels (except for postgraduate applicants).
- The applicant must not simultaneously apply to any other general or private admission channels within Iraqi universities.
- Dual enrollment in two separate academic programs simultaneously is strictly prohibited.
- Scholarship awardees are restricted exclusively to morning (full-time) study sessions, whereas self-funded students may opt for either morning or evening study sessions.

Chapter Two (2/3)

3. Privileges and Employment Regulations:

- Students admitted under the "Study in Iraq" initiative are explicitly excluded from employment privileges within Iraqi state ministries (the public sector) or any non-educational state benefits.
- Admitted students are strictly prohibited from engaging in any form of employment (part-time or full-time) throughout the entirety of their study period. The university bears no legal liability for any violations thereof. (Exceptions apply solely to Arab and foreign nationals actively employed in the diplomatic corps—i.e., embassies, consulates, and official diplomatic missions operating in Iraq).

4. Health and Safety Regulations & Appeals:

- The applicant must be entirely free from—and not a carrier of—any contagious or communicable diseases, nor suffer from any medical conditions that would impede the completion of their studies. This must be substantiated by an official, authenticated medical report conducted upon their arrival in Iraq.
- In the event an applicant is not nominated for admission, they retain the institutional right to submit an electronic appeal to request a formal review of their result, subject to established ministerial regulations.

Chapter Two (3/3)

II. Required Documentation (To be Uploaded via the Portal)

• The applicant is required to upload the following official documents in high resolution, exclusively in PDF format:

1. **Academic Certificates:** (High School/Bachelor's/Master's degrees). All certificates must include comprehensive academic transcripts (subjects and corresponding grades). Documents must be in color, translated into either Arabic or English, and legally authenticated by the Ministry of Education/Higher Education and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the applicant's home country.
2. If the issuing country utilizes an electronic authentication system (Barcode/QR code), the documents must be verified by the Iraqi Cultural Attaché or the Iraqi Embassy in the applicant's home country.
3. A temporary or permanent equivalency certificate issued by the Iraqi Ministry of Education (General Directorate for Examinations and Certificate Evaluation), if applicable.
4. An electronic copy (PDF) of the Master's thesis (Required strictly for Ph.D. applicants).
5. Upload of supplementary identification documents, if applicable (e.g., Iraqi residence ID, refugee ID).
6. A high-quality color copy (PDF) of a valid passport, possessing a minimum validity of two (2) years.
7. A recent, clear passport-style photograph (50×50 mm) with a plain white background, showing the full front face and shoulders, taken without eyeglasses.
8. A valid International Health Certificate, issued no more than three months prior, duly authenticated.
9. Official documentation proving the lineage/nationality of both the applicant and their parents (e.g., birth certificates, national identity cards, or passports of both parents).
10. A formal written pledge affirming the absolute accuracy of all provided information, confirming non-application to other Iraqi admission channels, and declaring the non-possession of (nor intent to apply for) Iraqi citizenship.

Chapter Three (1/3)

Scholarships and Tuition Fees

I. Scholarship Categories

Fully Funded Scholarships (Free Tuition)

This pertains to scholarships allocated for morning (full-time) study. It provides comprehensive coverage for academic tuition fees, university accommodation, and entry visa processing fees into the Republic of Iraq. The student remains responsible solely for initial application fees and mandatory health insurance costs.

Partially Funded Scholarships (Half-Free Tuition)

This pertains to scholarships allocated for morning (full-time) study. It covers exactly fifty percent (50%) of the established tuition fees, assessed in Iraqi Dinars (IQD) or its US Dollar (USD) equivalent. These fees are collected annually across all academic stages.

Self-Funded Study (Private Expense Channel)

This channel requires the student to bear the full cost of the established academic tuition fees, assessed in Iraqi Dinars or its USD equivalent, payable annually across all academic stages.

II. Financial Fees Structure

1. Partially Funded (Half-Free) Channel:

Students are required to pay 50% of the standard tuition fees designated for the self-funded channel, applicable to all academic years and dependent on the degree sought at public, private colleges, and universities. Fees are payable annually in IQD or the USD equivalent, as detailed below:

2. Self-Funded (Private Expense) Channel:

Students are required to pay the full, standard tuition fees designated for the self-funded channel, applicable to all academic years and dependent on the degree sought at public, private colleges, and universities. Fees are payable annually in IQD or the USD equivalent, as detailed below:

A. Undergraduate Studies (Public Universities, Private Colleges, and Universities)

Note 1: Tuition fees must be paid upon commencement of the academic program in structured installments. Specifically, postgraduate fees are divided into two installments annually, whereas undergraduate fees are divided into four installments annually.

Note 2: Students admitted under either the Partially Funded or Self-Funded channels cannot be granted fee waivers or further reductions without explicit, formalized approval from His Excellency the Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research.

Note 3: Nominal university housing fees will be collected from eligible students (under the Partially Funded and Self-Funded channels) based on current regulations. The Housing Administration clarifies that these are classified as nominal service fees and are completely waived for students admitted under the Fully Funded (Free) scholarship channel.

Chapter Four (1/2)

Initial Admission, Visa Procedures, and Arrival

I. Preliminary Admission

Upon initial acceptance via the electronic portal, a virtual interview (online) will be conducted for both nominated and reserve students. This process serves to determine the final roster of admitted students and to issue the preliminary University Admission Order.

II. Post-Admission Phase (Visa and Travel Procedures)

Following official notification of acceptance at the University of Misan via the "Study in Iraq" portal, the procedural phase for entering Iraqi territory commences through the following administrative steps:

1. **Communication and Coordination:** The university assumes responsibility for direct communication with the admitted student, providing detailed institutional guidance regarding the initiation of the entry visa application process.
2. **Visa Application (From the Student's Home Country):** The student must initiate the electronic entry visa request while residing in their home country, strictly via the following protocol:
 - **Application Submission:** Apply through the official, accredited portal of the Iraqi Ministry of Interior (Residency Directorate).
 - **Electronic Payment:** Process the required statutory fees for the visa application electronically.
 - **Tracking:** The relevant authorities will notify the student electronically regarding their application status following successful payment and submission.
3. **Visa Issuance and Travel Preparation:**
 - The university will forward the issued entry visa directly to the student immediately upon its release.
 - The student is granted a standard entry visa valid for sixty (60) days. Failure to enter Iraqi territory within this stipulated timeframe necessitates the submission of a secondary visa application.

Critical Notice: Upon receipt of the visa, the student must immediately verify the accuracy of all data, confirm the validity period, and coordinate intimately with the university regarding travel dates to ensure proper visa stamping at Iraqi airports and border crossings.

Chapter Four (2/2)

III. Reception and Arrival Protocols

1. Airport Reception and Accommodation:

- Upon arrival at the designated airport, an official university representative will receive the student and escort them safely to the university dormitories.
- **Housing Allocation:** Temporary accommodation is allocated immediately upon arrival. This is converted to permanent housing status once the student completes all requisite documentation required by the Department of Dormitory Affairs.
- **Off-Campus Housing:** Should a student prefer to reside outside the university complex, they are legally obligated to provide a residency endorsement signed by the local Mukhtar and authenticated by the district administration (Qaimmaqamiyah).

2. Document Verification:

The student, accompanied by a specialized committee, must visit the Department of Scholarships and Cultural Relations at the University Presidency to cross-reference original documents and verify data authenticity prior to college enrollment. The comprehensive physical file must contain the original and authenticated documents previously uploaded, plus:

- The University Admission Order (Color copy).
- The electronic entry visa issued to the student.
- The International Health Certificate (Original, authenticated copy).
- The Written Pledge (Original, authenticated copy).
- Twelve (12) recent passport-style photos (white background, 50×50 mm), clearly showing shoulders and taken without medical or sunglasses.

3. Commencement of Studies:

Procedures to officially commence studies are finalized, and a University Commencement Order is issued, following the meticulous auditing of the student's documents by the Student Affairs and Registration Division at the respective college.

4. Medical Examination (Detailed in Chapter 5).

5. Issuance of University ID:

The official University ID is issued exclusively after the submission of medical examination results and the housing endorsement to the college administration.

Mandatory Requirement: The student must revisit the Department of Scholarships and Cultural Relations to provide them with color copies of: The University ID, the Housing Endorsement, and the Commencement Order.

Chapter Five (1/2)

Medical Examination and Ur Portal Registration

Important Notice: Registration on the "Ur" electronic portal is strictly mandatory within a maximum of ten (10) days from the date of your entry into Iraq.

Step One: Accessing the Service and Portal Login

- **Email Login:** Select the option to apply via Email.
- Input your personal email address and click 'Submit'.
- A 5-digit verification code will be dispatched to your email. Copy this code, paste it into the verification field, and click 'Confirm'.

Step Two: Completing the Application Form

Accurately input your personal data exactly as it appears on your official documentation:

- **Full Name:** (First Name - Middle Name - Surname).
- **Profession:** Select (Student).
- **Passport Number:** Enter your valid passport number.
- **Nationality:** Select your nationality from the dropdown menu.
- **Place of Residence in Iraq:** Select the governorate (Maysan).
- **Gender:** Select (Male / Female).
- **Age Category:** Select the appropriate bracket (e.g., between 14 to 60 years).
- **Ethnicity:** Select ethnicity (e.g., Arab, etc.).
- **Country of Origin:** If your country is absent from the list, select 'Other' and manually type the country name.
- **Type of Request:** Select (Authentication of International Health Certificate).
- **Exemption Type:** Select (Students admitted under the Study in Iraq Initiative).
- **Booking the Examination:** Select an available date for your medical appointment.
- **Resident's Address:** Enter (University Dormitories).
- **Date of Entry:** Input your exact date of entry into Iraq.
- Click the (Save and Continue) button.

Chapter Five (2/2)

Step Three: Uploading Documents and Attachments

Strict Requirement: All documents must be uploaded exclusively as image files in (JPG / JPEG) format. The file size for each image must not exceed 5 Megabytes (MB).

- **Passport:** Upload a highly legible image of the biographical data page of your passport.
- **Proof of Latest Entry:** Upload a clear image of the Iraqi entry stamp or the visa page affixed to your passport.
- Click (Save and Continue) and wait for the confirmation message stating (Files Saved Successfully).

Step Four: Application Review and Final Submission

- A summary page displaying all entered application details will appear.
- Scroll down to meticulously review all data and uploaded images to ensure absolute accuracy.
- Click the green (Submit Application) button to successfully finalize the process.

Step Five: Follow-up and Completion of the Examination

- The student is responsible for personally following up and completing all subsequent procedures.
- **Appointment Confirmation:** Following portal submission, the student will receive an official notification via email detailing the exact time and designated medical center for the examination.
- **Conducting the Examination:** The student must personally attend the designated medical center at the scheduled time, bearing the University Admission Order and the examination booking form.
- **Receipt and Distribution of Results:** Upon issuance of the medical clearance, the student must retrieve it personally and distribute color copies to:
 1. The Department of Scholarships and Cultural Relations.
 2. The Department of Dormitory Affairs.
 3. The Residency Directorate (to initiate residency permit processing).
- The original copy must be submitted directly to the Student Affairs and Registration Division at the respective college.

Chapter Six (1/2)

Study Residence Permit Procedures

- The administrative procedures to issue the official Study Residence Card (Permit) must commence immediately upon the student's official commencement of studies and strictly within the validity period of the initial entry visa. Failure to comply will result in statutory delay fines levied against the student by the Ministry of Interior.
- The official documentation required to process the residence permit includes:
 - A copy of the electronic entry visa issued to the student.
 - A color copy of the student's valid passport.
 - The official medical examination result issued by the Iraqi Ministry of Health.
 - A certified copy of the University Order confirming the student's admission.
 - A certified copy of the Administrative Order confirming the student's commencement of studies.
 - The official University or College ID card.
 - A formal housing endorsement from the Department of Dormitory Affairs. Should the student reside off-campus, an official housing endorsement from the Provincial Council is strictly required.
- The student is legally obligated to cover all application processing fees alongside an insurance deposit amounting to 105,000 Iraqi Dinars (IQD), which is to be transferred directly by the student.
- The Ministry of Interior (Residency Directorate) grants the student a residence permit valid for one (1) academic year. This permit is renewable for only one subsequent year at a time. The student must adhere strictly to these timelines. Upon exhausting the granted residency periods, the student is required to formally apply for a new entry visa, exit Iraqi territory, and re-enter using the newly issued visa.

Chapter Six (2/2)

- Should a student require international travel and re-entry during the validity of their annual residence permit (e.g., for summer vacation or emergencies), they must formally apply for an Exit and Re-entry Visa. This incurs an administrative fee of 38,000 IQD, payable directly to the Ministry of Interior (Residency Directorate).
- Pursuant to prevailing residency laws, any previously issued multiple-entry visas intended for employment purposes are nullified for students admitted under the initiative (specifically the Fully Funded channel). Such students must cancel their previous visa, apply for the designated student visa, and exit the borders to officially change their visa status. The student bears sole responsibility for any financial costs or delay fines registered at the Residency Directorate as a result.
- The student must initiate the residence permit renewal process at least one month (30 days) prior to the expiration date. The student assumes full financial liability for any statutory delay fines incurred due to failure to apply for issuance or renewal within the mandated timeframe.

Institutional Note regarding Family Accompaniment:

Should a student desire to bring family members, the following administrative procedures are mandatory:

- The student must first complete all procedures for the issuance of their own annual residence permit.
- The student must apply directly via their personal account to the Residency Directorate. This process bypasses the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research entirely.

Chapter Seven

Arabic Language Proficiency Course

I. Language Placement Assessment (For Non-Arabic Speakers)

- Prior to commencing academic studies, non-Arabic speaking students are subjected to a mandatory placement test administered by a specialized academic committee comprising faculty from the Department of Arabic Language.
- The comprehensive placement test entails:
 - A written examination to rigorously evaluate reading, writing, grammar, and vocabulary proficiency.
 - An oral interview designed to assess listening comprehension and conversational fluency.
- Based strictly on the empirical results of this assessment, the committee categorizes students into appropriate language proficiency levels corresponding to their linguistic capabilities.

II. Duration of the Course

Arabic language intensive courses are conducted prior to the commencement of the academic year. The duration of study is predicated on the level determined by the placement assessment, structured as follows:

- **Beginner Level:** One full academic year.
- **Intermediate Level:** Six (6) months.
- **Advanced Level:** Three (3) months.
- Upon successful completion of the final examination, the student is awarded an official Certificate of Proficiency for the respective level.

III. Financial Fees for the Arabic Language Course

Tuition for the language course varies according to the student's admission channel:

- **Fully Funded Scholarship:** The student is completely exempt from all course fees.
- **Partially Funded Scholarship:** A subsidized fee of 100 USD is applied.
- **Self-Funded (Private) Channel:** A standard fee of 200 USD is applied.

Chapter Eight (1/2)

University Accommodation and Transportation

The University of Misan prioritizes the welfare of its male and female students by providing dedicated dormitory complexes. These facilities are designed as optimal residential environments that foster psychological and academic stability, meeting the rigors of university life within a secure and highly organized setting.

1. On-Campus Housing for Male Students

The male student accommodation comprises an integrated residential complex consisting of three edifices, equipped with multiple wings and rooms meticulously prepared to host students. The exact geographic location can be viewed via the link below:

Room allocation is systematically organized according to the academic stage and degree type. Generally, undergraduate students are housed at a density of (5-6) individuals per room, whereas postgraduate students are allocated (3-4) individuals per room. This ratio is subject to slight adjustments based on annual enrollment metrics.

2. On-Campus Housing for Female Students

The female student accommodation consists of a secure three-story building, heavily prioritizing privacy, comfort, and safety. The exact geographic location can be viewed via the link below:

Similarly, room allocation is determined by academic standing. Undergraduate female students reside at a density of (2-3) per room, while postgraduate female students are allocated (4-5) per room, contingent upon the facility's maximum operational capacity and annual intake.

Amenities and Infrastructure

The university ensures that the dormitories are furnished with fundamental living requisites. Standard provisions per room include: beds, blankets, pillows, a dedicated refrigerator per room, a deep freezer shared between every two rooms, carpets, wardrobes, mirrors, curtains, air conditioning units, and heating appliances. Shared infrastructure includes communal kitchens stocked with basic culinary equipment, and sanitary facilities serving the student populace. Water and electricity are provided on a near-continuous basis.

While internet connectivity is technically available within the dormitories, it is currently not a subsidized (free) service. Students frequently rely on mobile cellular data plans, particularly within the female dormitories.

Chapter Eight (2/2)

Regulations and Disciplinary Guidelines

Residency within the university dormitories is strictly governed by an internal regulatory framework. This encompasses student duties, curfew mechanisms (entry and exit logs), visitor reception protocols, property conservation mandates, and overarching behavioral obligations. These regulations are stringently enforced to guarantee discipline, maintain public order, and sustain a secure residential environment highly conducive to rigorous academic study.

Academic Calendar (2026-2027)

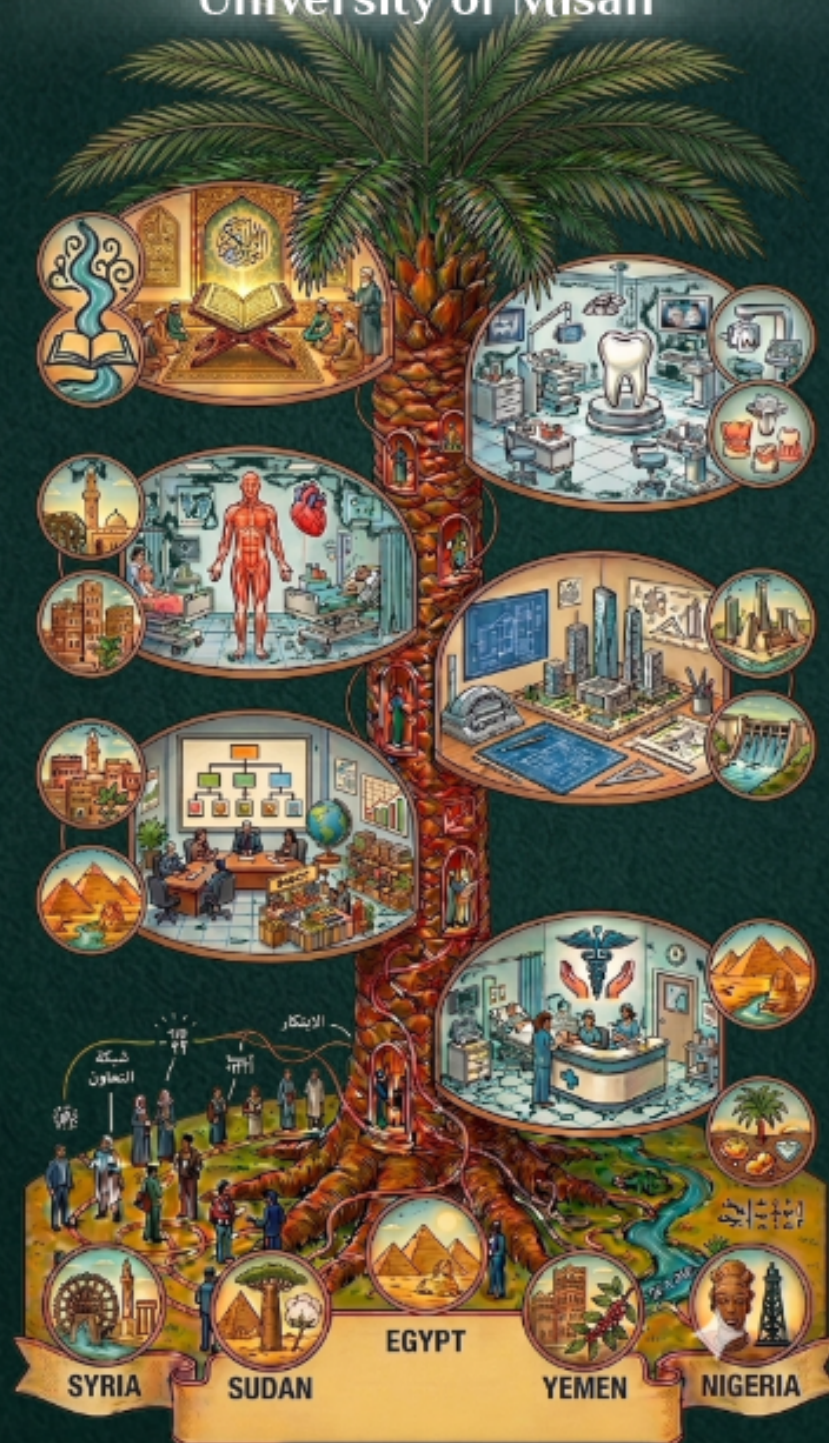
