<u>Program Objectives:</u> They are statements that describe what the academic program intends to achieve within a specific period of time and are measurable and observable.



- 5- Faculty members at the college accompanying students on field visits to courts and other government departments related to the field of law to develop their skills and acquire the necessary information.




